

The Town of Saranac Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee is requesting resident feedback on the Town's draft Comprehensive Plan and Revitalization Strategy. In August last year, Saranac residents were invited to attend a public meeting to share their goals for Saranac's future. For the past eight months the Saranac Advisory Committee has been working on the development of a Town-wide Comprehensive Plan and Revitalization Strategy which includes a broad vision and set of goals for the future as well as specific actions to achieve those goals. The Plan addresses economic revitalization, recreation, community character, Route 3 corridor improvements, housing, infrastructure and the provision of community services.

The Plan will guide the Town as it makes important decisions about its future; it will provide regional, State and Federal entities with an understanding of the Town's vision, goals and priorities; and it will open doors to funding for community projects identified in the Plan. Residents of the Town of Saranac are encouraged to review the plan and provide comments to the Project Advisory Committee, since resident feedback is critical to getting the Plan right.

The Project Advisory Committee will hold a meeting to review all comments and finalize the Plan on Thursday, June 16 at 6:00 pm at the Town Hall.

After the Project Advisory Committee makes any revisions to the draft Comprehensive Plan, it will be forwarded to the Department of State, the Clinton County Planning Office, the Department of Environmental Conservation, and the Adirondack Park Agency for review and comment. Following this review, the Saranac Town Board will hold a public hearing as they consider adoption of the Plan.

The project is funded by a grant from the NYS Department of State Division of Coastal Resources through the Environmental Protection Fund Local Waterfront Revitalization Program and assistance from NYS Senator Betty Little.
