Notice of Highway Defects

LOCAL LAW NO. 2 of the year 2020

A local law providing for written notification of defects and obstructions on town highways, bridges, streets, sidewalks, orosswelles and outverts in the Tewn of Saranao.

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Saranac,

Section 1: No civil actions shall be maintained against the town or town superintendent of highways for damages or injuries to person or property sustained by reason of any highway, bridge, street, sidewalk, crosswalk or culvert being defective, out of repair, unsafe, dangerous or obstructed unless written actice of such defective, unsafe, dangerous, or obstructed condition of such highway, bridge, street, sidewalk, crosswalk or onlyert was actually given to the town clerk or town superintendent of highways, and there was a failure or neglect within a reasonable time after the giving of such notice to repair or remove the defect, danger or obstruction complained of. No such action shall be maintained for damages or injuries to person or property sustained solely in consequence of the existence of snow or ice upon any highway, bridge, street, sidewalk, crosswalk or onlyert, unless written notice thereaf, specifying the particular place, was actually given to the town clerk or town superintendent of highways and there was failure or neglect to cause such snew or ice to be removed, or to make the place otherwise reasonably safe within a reasonable time after the receipt of such notice.

Section 2. The town superintendent of highways shall transmit in writing to the town clerk within ten days after the receipt thereof all written notices received pursuant to this local law.

Section 3. It is the intent of the Town Beard, pursuant to the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York, to supersede such portions of § 65-a of the Town Law of the State of New York. This Local law shall supersede in its application NYS Town Law §65 a, Sections 1, 2 & 3.

Section 4. This local law shall take effect immediately upon its filing in the office of the Secretary of
