**MONTHLY REPORT MAY 2019**  
April 22, 2019 to June 24, 2019

**May 20, 2019**

Received a message from Leslie Hutchins, Hardscrabble Road, regarding the neighbor's dogs, pit bulls, at the white house next door. They are coming in her yard and growling at her. I went and spoke with the dog owner, Kelsie Gilman and gave her a written warning and advised her of the local law.

**May 22, 2019**

Received a message from Rita Wilson, Redford, regarding a dog owned by Josh Vann. Mrs. Wilson has made complaints in the past, she doesn't leave a call back number and doesn't answer the door when I go to her residence. I cannot just go take a dog out of someone's home without a court order. The dog wasn't being mistreated so no action was taken.

**May 30, 2019**

Received a message that was illegible, I called the Town Supervisor, Nick Carter and explained that I could not understand anything that was said. I asked that if someone called about me not acting on this to please get information and let me know so I could look into it.

**June 13, 2019**

Received a message from "Allison", 101 Emmons Street regarding a St. Bernard, at 105 Emmons Street that runs loose and chased her sister. I went to 101 Emmons Street and spoke with Bryant Lewis, I issued him a warning and explained the Local Law and what would happen if another complaint was received. His dog is licensed in the Town of Dannemora.

**June 18, 2019**

Received a message from Donna Lynch regarding dogs on the Nashville Road at the Todd Parrotte residence and the Luke Kiroy residence. I went to the Parrotte residence, and spoke with the new owner, Shane McClean and also to the Luke Kiroy residence and issued written warnings to both residents, gave them copies of the Local Law and also advised them what would happen if another complaint was received.

**June 21, 2019**

Received a call from Karen Gould, McCutcheon Lane, regarding a Huskey running at large on Route 3. Ms. Gould was afraid the dog would get hit, she left no call back number. The description she gave of the dog sounds like Robbie LaVarnway's Huskey. I went through the area two times while going to and from my bus run and did not see the dog anywhere. Robbie's dog gets loose a lot and usually runs right down Route 3. I have brought his dog back on several occasions. The dog is an escape artist and I'm afraid it is just a matter of time before he becomes a statistic of Route 3.
