The Saranac CDBG Home Rehab Project has four projects underway. Disbursements to contractors and

RPC have begun. Our plans for the winter are to continue with work scopes and line up work for spring/summer 2020. Our deadline to complete the CDBG project is January 25, 2021.

The **Saranac HOME project** also has four projects underway. We are under the first file review at this time, which means RPC will have that file complete for construction to begin and then the next three will have the green light to proceed shortly after. The deadline for the HOME project is May 23, 2021.

The **Clinton County Access to Home grant** has two projects under construction, two are close to being awarded, and another three not far behind. These funds are providing accessibility improvements to people with disabilities. We have most, if not all, of the funds allocated, with a deadline for this project of May 23, 2021.

A **Saranac AHC (Affordable Housing Corporation)** home rehab application is under review. The purpose of this grant is to complete the last qualified homes in the Town of Saranac (\$800,000 CDBG and Home grant are not enough). I now realize that every step of these processes is lengthy and complicated. It has been explained to me that (referring to submitted AHC grant) once our application gets through the first round, it is reviewed by NYS Construction Team, OEOPD (Office of Economic Opportunity and Partnership Development), and the legal department, including background searches. If the application survives these processes, it will be presented to the Credit Committee. If approved, the project is presented to the NYS Board for funding approval (January is the earliest we can possibly hear). If approved by the Board, we will go to contract (another 3- or 4-month process) before jobs go out to bid. If funded, we will begin planning to allocate AHC funds for the 2021 construction season for the remaining homes in Saranac (that qualify for rehab work).

We have also submitted a **RESTORE grant**, which would assist Clinton County homeowners with emergency home repairs. We likely will not hear about this award until late winter. In the meantime, we have, and will continue to use, **Emergency Home Repair Funds**, **donated by local businesses and foundations**. The objective of this fund is to make small, urgent repairs that will last until we can use RESTORE funds.

RPC has a **database** now, with a **waitlist** of those with housing needs that do not fall into grants currently awarded. It is never too late to get on our wait list and get on **Friends of the North Country's** waitlist. They can be reached at **518-293-5045**. Together, both rural preservation companies are attempting to address Clinton County housing needs. **Waitlists prove the need** for grants to be awarded in our county. However, please understand the very lengthy process it takes from a homeowner's application to completed work.

HISTORICAL HAPPENINGS-

THE CENSUS IS COMING!

THE CENSUS IS COMING.... BUT NOT UNTIL **2092!** Yes, it's true you and I will not be able to see the actual information collected until 2092. The 'Manuscript' Census is kept from the public for 72 years to protect the privacy of the people listed. 2022 will see the release of the 1950 Census.

We know the reason for the Census is to **aid in voting**, **school funding**, **taxing**, **population distribution** and many other uses. The Census is a gold mine for those interested in numbers and statistics.

Historians eat up this information, too. What do historians do with the information? We find all sorts of things that give us a glimpse into a virtual time machine. Saranac's first Census was in 1830 and you can find many things about your town by studying the data. I've discovered that Pup Hill Road is recorded as Pulp Hill Road in the 1940 Census. Using the Occupation tab, it was easy to locate where bloomers lived during the 1870-1880 period. Seeing how families spread from a single homestead to several neighboring farms over the course of 20 or 30 years helps with tracing movements and growth of families. Various names listed for the Census for the **Standish** area are many who still live there today. The hardest thing to decipher is the handwriting. Some enumerators had horrible handwriting and others were precise.

With so many of our residents coming from **French Canada**, the spelling of the names is sometimes problematic. It wasn't until 1930 the name **Durocher** appears as we know it. *Derusia, Derusha, Duroce, Demsha, Durosha*, and *Duroche* all appeared throughout the years.

There is so much to learn from the last 23 Census reports. The question remains: What will the reports look like in 2092 when historians get a glimpse into a window of our 2020 lives. To see the Census from 1790 to 1940, you can use ancestry.com, which is available for **free in many** libraries. Also free is www.familysearch.org. For a free guide to Census records and hints, go to www.archives.gov/files/ research/census/

I've lived in Saranac all my life and my genealogy-buff daughter has our local roots traced back to before the War of 1812 My wife, Barbara, and I live on Burnt Hill where we raised our three daughters.

My formal training is in Management and Economics, so along with my business experience, I can hopefully do a good job performing the Supervisor's duties.

2019 was a very productive year. The **Standish Water District Upgrade** is complete and online. The Town of Saranac has one of the most modern water distribution systems in Clinton County.

Rural Preservation Corporation, the Town's partner for the Community Development Black Grant, has begun rehabilitation of two homes in the town, with more projects in the pipe line.

NEWS FROM MOUNTAIN LIONS SNOWSLED

The Mountain Lions SnowSled Club has been extremely busy preparing the local trails for the upcoming snow season. Some clearing of downed trees has been accomplished on the main trail C8A (railbed from Dannemora to Lyon Mountain), but the most extensive work has been on our two secondary trails.

Our S88A trail, from Lyon Mountain to the Owlyout Bar and Grill has had its upper half between Lyon Mountain and lower Sunset Road extensively widened and a complete new bridge installed. This project took MANY man hours and was greatly aided by the participation of numerous local individuals. The leader of this project, John McKinney, was instrumental in coordinating personnel, material, and equipment. The end result is a trail that can now be groomed by our large -size tracked snow groomer and should significantly improve riding conditions at least as far as Sunset road. Next year and beyond, we hope to improve or even relocate the trail beyond lower Sunset to move away from riding alongside Rt. 374.

This effort involved significant work on the Perry Family properties to remove stumps and rocks, install gates and snow fence to constrain riders to the authorized trail, and the installation of two small bridges over a brook that is a natural spring which never freezes. We DID have one very exciting day where we thought we might lose one of our members' tractor in some very soft ground, but after several hours of digging and pulling, we were able to successfully remove it, much to the happiness of the owner!

Just as we advised the owners of Hi Falls that the trail was complete and open, we received word of a loss of property crossing authorization under the power lines along the Saranac River.

This necessitated a last minute trail reroute behind the **Draper family residence**, for which we would like to publicly thank them for allowing this access. PLEASE REMEMBER – when riding these trails, **you are being permitted to cross** PRIVATE PROPERTY by the individual Land Owners – all it takes is one renegade operator to ride off trail, and that access can be lost – which CAN result in the trail being permanently closed! PLEASE STAY ON THE TRAIL!!


